ome of you may know that, partly out of meeting Mary, but partly building on existing interests in art and history, I have taken up designing scrolls in the style of the mediaeval manuscript illuminators. The letter "S" shown here is one of mine, based on the style of decorative letters used in a French manuscript in Salisbury Cathedral library, which I was shown around earlier this year.

There is currently a superb exhibition on at the Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge, if you are interested in such things. In the finest examples, each page is a work of art. The best of illuminators were in no way inferior to the painters of their day, though art history as I learned it totally ignored the former in favour of the latter. I suspect that at least sometimes the illuminators were ahead of the curve... for example, the surreal grotesques of Hieronymus Bosch and Pieter Brueghel had appeared in the margins of illuminated manuscripts for centuries before those painters lived.

Many, most indeed, of the works so illuminated are religious texts: Bibles, Psalters, Missals and so on for the church liturgy, Books of Hours for private devotions, books of theology for the scholarly. The sheer amount of work that went into such works is unbelievable... the period of time from ordering a book to receiving it shows a rather different approach to life to that of the Amazon Kindle generation. This meant that books were scarce... in the mediaeval era, the entire book collection of an individual, or even many institutions, could be housed in a box, not a room or a building, hence the word "archive" from "arca", a box. Books were valued, and only those topics most worthy of the effort, were reproduced as manuscripts (cont. on page 2)

.... But of course, the very fact of the cost and rarity of books meant that they became status symbols. Many, especially later in the period, were produced as gifts to impress nobility or royalty, or commissioned by them to show off their wealth and good taste. These tend to be the ones that make it into museums and exhibitions, and give us our taste of what mediaeval books were like.

Actually, my visit to the Salisbury Cathedral library showed that there was another side to it. The books produced in Salisbury Cathedral were simple and unadorned. Salisbury's scriptorium, on the contrary, was recognised for the speed and accuracy with which it could copy (and return!) another manuscript. It was not the look of the book that mattered... it was its content.

The mass-printed Bibles of today are a world away from the manuscripts of which I have been writing. They do not tell of the care and devotion that the scribe put into producing them, and the value which he invested in them. But on the other hand, what a great thing that we can so easily have access to a book which for so long was the privilege of a few. Indeed, to knowledge in general... and how access to that has changed even in our own generation. Time was, to find out a piece of information you had to go to a library, through it access the national lending scheme, and wait weeks while the book was transferred to your local library for you to collect. Now you just type what you want to know into "Google", and chances are you will have immediate access to the information you need.

No generation before ours has had such easy access to knowledge, information, literature and art. But as so often, that which is easily obtained, is easily ignored or devalued. Those who engaged so whole-heartedly with books in the mediaeval age would have dreamed of having the knowledge we have... but perhaps we for our part can envy them their wisdom.




