## **Good News**

Well, at long last we are able to state publicly that we have a new Team Rector for the Chalke Valley Team Ministry, a successor to Canon David Henley, who left in February 2014. It has of course been widely known that we have interviewed three times, the first two unsuccessfully, and it has also been widely known for some time that on the third occasion, we did indeed find a very strong candidate. However, technically the responsibility for offering the post lay with the Archbishop of Canterbury's Office and there were delays because the key person there was on holiday, and then further delays which were (I assume) caused by an unwillingness to announce the candidate's departure from her old parish over Easter.

But at last all is public, and I am pleased to announce to those who have not yet heard, that our new Rector is to the Revd Catherine Blundell, currently Vicar of Winkfield and Cranbourne in East Berkshire. As one of those involved in the interview, I can tell you that Catherine interviewed exceptionally well, and the choice was unanimous (and almost instantaneous!). I think she will be a great asset to the Chalke Valley. She will live in Broad Chalke, but have overall responsibility for the whole Chalke Valley Benefice, including the area covered by "News and Notes". She will lead the clergy team of which Jenny Taylor and I will continue to be part.

The date of her service of Installation looks likely to be 7<sup>th</sup> July (at one point I had been told 30<sup>th</sup> June, so you may have heard that date from me, but it seems now to have been superseded).

On a completely different note, but while I have the floor, just to let you know that I have had preliminary talks about a youth club in Charlton All Saints, where we seem currently to have a number of children in the older primary/younger secondary age group. Ideas are very vestigial at present, but watch this space and give me a ring if you would like to be kept informed or get involved.

Also happening in our area is the Filling Station, an opportunity to come together for worship and teaching for Christians from South Wiltshire. It is not the property of the Chalke Valley Benefice or any other individual church, but aims to provide an additional place of spiritual refreshment for those from any denomination. It meets for the first time on 29<sup>th</sup> April, and thereafter on the 4th Wednesday of each month in the Radnor Hall.

So, a lot of positives, and as the sun is starting to emerge, the trees to bud, the flowers to open, good things lie ahead for the Chalke Valley!

### We need your help to create a village plan that can shape the future of our community

The Localism Act 2011 allows communities a voice in planning for the future and can include issues such as residential and commercial developments, transport, education and leisure infrastructures.

With the support of Odstock Parish Council, a small steering group has begun the task of developing a plan for Odstock, Nunton and Bodenham. There is much involved, but the first real task is to decide on the type of plan the community would prefer. There are a number of models to choose from, but given the size and nature of Odstock Parish, the choice probably lies between a Parish Plan and a Neighbourhood Plan.

Parish plans can cover all issues of concern to local people including social, economic and environmental issues. Parish plans are non-statutory documents. The plan, when completed, highlights actions that can be taken by the community in partnership with the parish council. It can be used to influence service providers such as Wiltshire Council, and act as evidence of need when applying for funding.

Neighbourhood Plans focus on land use planning. Unlike Parish Plans, Neighbourhood Plans are statutory documents and, once made, form part of the development plan for an area. They enable communities to identify where they would like new homes, shops and offices to be built, have their say on what those new buildings should look like and to grant planning permission for new buildings using Neighbourhood Development Orders.

Both types of plan are based on the results of research and consultation using a variety of information gathering methods that involve the whole community. The steering group will expand its membership to include representatives from all sections of the community as the project develops, but the next action will be to call an open meeting or meetings at which anyone will be able to state their views on what they see as important issues for the future of our community. This is called 'scoping' and your views will determine the type of plan we adopt.

*We hope to arrange the first open meeting during June, but if you have any questions in the meantime or would like to volunteer as a representative to join the steering group, please contact me at any time.*

## Longford C of E Primary School

Staff and pupils returned to school following the Easter break to find a new shed, which had been requested by the pupils and bought by Friends of Longford School – FOLS. The new shed is storing the children's outdoor toys including some new scooters and pogo sticks, bought by the School Council using money raised by Sally Crook in the Salisbury half-marathon last year.

The new pogo sticks, which arrived just before term ended, have proved extremely popular with Archie being the first to make over 100 continuous jumps. Mrs Matthews, one of our Teaching Assistants, was not so proficient and fell off without injury, we are glad to say, except perhaps to her dignity. But we all admire her bravery.

Less exiting but no less necessary is a new wooden picket fence surrounding the play area helping to keep the children safe.

This term pupils started their new topics. Kestrels (Reception year): Plants and Flowers, Magpies (Years 1 and 2): I'm Alive and Kingfishers (Years 3 – 6): Do You Live Around Here?

For the younger children this will mean a trip to the Moors Valley Country Park. Kingfishers are packing their bags for a 3 day residential at the PGL Camp at Liddington, one of their biggest adventure centres, so there's acres of space for the children to enjoy and plenty of activities to inspire, motivate and challenge them.

The Easter Fair at the end of last term was a great success, raising £100. The Easter Egg and Chocolate tombola stall was busiest as children crowded round hoping to win a prize or two. Others were guessing the number of sweeties in a huge jar! Sadly my guesses were very wide of the mark but Alex won himself 114 sweeties.

But anyone missing out on the chocolate and sweets could still obtain an Easter treat from a wide range of baked goodies on the Cake Stall including a magnificent family-sized chocolate cake, chocolate brownies, beautifully decorated cupcakes as well as Rice Krispie cakes made by the children at school. (Money from the Cake Stall was donated to The National Autism Society, so supporting World Autism Awareness Week). There were also plants, books and nail painting on offer.

Fund raising for Red Nose Day came to an impressive £137.01 given the fact there are only 43 children on the roll.




