Welcome to the New Team Vicar

Reverend Alison Williams was appointed Team Vicar in the Chalke Valley Team at the interviews on 4th March, and will be moving into Nunton Vicarage in the middle of May. She will be Licensed by the Bishop of Salisbury at 7.30pm on Tuesday, 1st June in St. Andrew's Church, Nunton. We are investigating how many people can squeeze into Nunton Church for this special occasion, and afterwards there will be the usual reception in the Radnor Hall at Bodenham. In addition to ourselves there will be Alison's personal friends, a party from her present parish and clergy from the Chalke Deanery.

For the last four years Alison has been Assistant Curate in the Stratton St. Margaret with South Marston and Stanton Fitzwarren Team Ministry on the outskirts of Swindon in the Diocese of Bristol, following her ordination training at Wycliffe Hall, Oxford. Prior to that she was a French teacher and then worked in the Church in full-time lay employment for twenty years. These posts included a national organisation concerned with children and youth work, and parishes in Manchester and Bristol where she was responsible for adult training and education. She brings to us a wide range of experience and expertise. Her present Team includes two small villages and she has developed a taste for rural life.

Alison is single and lists among her interests France and all things French, music and singing, gardening and entertaining. She has contacts in Bangladesh and is enthusiastic about our Lent Project. Her first priority once she starts her ministry here will be to get out and about in the villages and make contact with people. On her initial Sundays in June she will have a chance to spend a morning with each of the parishes in turn.

Please remember Alison in your prayers as she says her farewells in her present parish, completes her move and prepares for her licensing. We very much look forward to her joining the clergy Team and I believe she has a great deal to offer to us here. I hope she will find great happiness and fulfilment in the Chalke Valley.
