Font sizes

Of course, I'm being silly. The font sizes I'm referring to relate to the text in printed documents like News and Notes. Most commonly, I use **Arial 10**, as this is. I used to use **Arial 11**, but there's so much interesting stuff to pack in that I went down a size some while ago to make more room!

I'm constantly amazed at what small sizes are used in some printed material these days. **This is Arial 9. And this is Arial 8.** We hear about the small print in relation to legal documents, but how small can it get? **As small as Arial 7, or even Arial 6?**

I regret that our copying process may not have coped too well with reproducing the smaller text above. If you're wondering what it says, check News and Notes on the website. It should be clear there.

The new Committee was announced with three new members welcomed:- Sally Hadley, Dee Prince and Rosemary Stephens. Heather Morrison was elected as President.

Staff and pupils returned to school following the February half-term break with the glad news that the HMI Report of the latest School Inspection Visit has concluded the School to be making 'reasonable progress' – the best possible outcome at this stage of the ongoing review. Congratulations to all pupils and staff for all their hard work!

This term pupils started their new topics. Reception: *Going Places*, Years 1 and 2: *Say Cheese!* And years 3 – 6: *Do You Live Around Here?*

In addition to their regular work, the focus on the first few weeks has centred on Reading and Writing. Almost 75% of the children came to the annual Story Time in their pyjamas, onesies, dressing gowns and slippers carrying their favourite cuddly toy (or car in one case). Parents and staff took turns to read stories old and new including 'Where's My Teddy' by Jez Alborough and an adventure from 'The Cherrys of River House' by Will Scott from 1952. Halfway through the children took time out for a mug of hot chocolate and biscuits before returning for a game of Simon Says and a final story or two before going home.

The following day pupils and staff came dressed as their favourite book character for World Book Day which saw characters from 'Where's Wally?' and 'Room on the Broom' playing together. (*See the News and Notes website for a picture*).

The culmination of these literary activities was a visit from Debi Evans, author of children's books including 'The Secret Adventures of Rolo'. Debi spent the morning talking to the children about the inspiration for her books and how she uses these to write her stories. The children were captivated and inspired by her visit.

On Friday 13 March, the children did their bit for Comic Relief by baking and decorating biscuits for sale as well as buying red noses.

The last day of term will conclude with an Easter Service at 1.30pm at Britford Church followed by an Easter Fair, hosted by FOLS, at the School from 3pm.






