From the Revd Jenny Taylor

Christmas and the New Year have come and gone; the weather has veered from one extreme to another and I suppose if we are honest, we are all feeling a little bit down in the dumps. The children sing a song in their school collective worship about just such a feeling, and the advice given is “count your blessings, name them one by one”. Easy to say and rather a glib comment, which is designed to make you feel worse! However, it really is true that if we think about what we DO have and what we ARE instead of what we DON’T and ARE NOT, we do begin to feel marginally less “down in the dumps”!

One thing we all are is part of that great story we have recently celebrated – the story of God loving us all so much that he came among us as a baby, to grow up, to live, to feel, to share all the things that humans do and are. And that story is still going on and WE are still part of it. Before too long we shall come to the time when we focus on the sacrifice that only supreme love can make – what we call Lent, Holy Week and Easter. You will all be receiving a Chalke Valley team Ministry leaflet on what is happening in Lent and I really do encourage everyone to take your part in this story as much as you did the Christmas one. So, if you are a bit “down in the dumps” or “feeling blue” please take heart that you are part of the world that God loved so much that he gave us his only Son, not to condemn the world but that the world might be saved through Him. 

Help and support for people who care

According to the last census, there are 47,608 people in Wiltshire providing care and support to a relative, child, partner or friend who would not be able to manage on their own.

There are many reasons why someone may not be able to cope unaided, including physical or mental disability, old age, long-term illness, special educational need, eating disorder or a problem with drugs or alcohol.

It is estimated that 3 in 5 people will become a carer at some point in their lives. The problem is that most people will not identify themselves as such – people simply consider themselves as a spouse, sibling, parent, grandparent or friend doing what they would be doing anyway. Many also mistake the word ‘carer’ with those providing *paid* care work in a residential home or domiciliary agency capacity.

Carer Support Wiltshire is a charity with a team of support workers who can provide information and support to carers living in Wiltshire, at the other end of the telephone, or face to face, along with access to counselling and advice relating to your role. All of our services are free and confidential for anyone aged 18 and over, and we can offer you the chance to have a break through social cafés, days out, activities, craft groups and complementary therapies.

We will shortly be running a monthly carers café in Salisbury where you can come along to chat with other carers over a hot drink or two.

"At the Southend Council STARS Award, the 2012/13 Winter Night Shelter partnership (the Council's Housing Options Team, HARP and the 7 Churches) won the Excellence in Partnership Award.

The Nightshelter was run by seven Southend Churches, each opening one night per week from 1st November to 28th February to provide homeless people with a hot meal and somewhere to sleep for the night. Housing Action Resource Project (Southend's main homelessness charity) acted as the referral agency and the Council provided funding.

Rick's role was to recruit the churches (and volunteers where these did not come directly from the churches themselves), to plan the project and set up the structures and training. Once the project started he was centre manager for one of the seven churches."

Congratulations, Rick. This seems like wonderful recognition for an extremely valuable job well done.






