## Broadband is coming.....or not!

As a retired IT professional I am an avid IT user and advocate of computers and the internet. My wife and I are also newcomers to Odstock having moved here from Hampton Park in the city in July 2012. Just as we left Hampton Park, BT Infinity (fast broadband) was being rolled out to my neighbourhood. The delights of village life in Odstock weighed heavily against staying put purely on IT grounds!

At present my BT broadband connection here in Odstock is a maximum of 2.5Mbps on a good day and frequently hovers around 1.5Mbps. Enquiries to BT suggest that it will be some time before BT Infinity is rolled out to the villages. I contacted the Wiltshire On Line office and had a very full and courteous reply,

reassuring me that Odstock and Nunton were "in our programme intervention area" and that this means that "our project is able to invest in and survey your area." However, the reply emphasised that a survey was only the start of a long process and I was not able to ascertain any forecast whatsoever of the start of any survey far less any infrastructure improvements. The current economic outlook for Local Government funding would tend to suggest that I should not hold my breath!

Of course running fibre optic cable out from the exchange in the City to a street cabinet or to the home is a very expensive undertaking and commercial realities these days mean that no supplier can afford to undertake infrastructure work unless there is a viable commercial case based on likely return on investment. However, a reliable, fast broadband service is becoming a necessity these days and would certainly help local businesses to flourish and residents to enjoy the full scope of benefits of internet access and communication. As more and more Government services require online access and everyday activities such as shopping, banking and entertainment are increasingly internet-based, it is smaller communities like ours that will lose out more and more.

When considering commercial viability, however, an equally significant factor in the equation is consumer demand. Inevitably, small villages like ours that are geographically dispersed cannot separately hope to constitute a concentration of demand in one place sufficient to attract supplier investment. If, however, we were able to combine our efforts then (to misquote a phrase) united we might stand a chance!

Driving through Pitton recently I saw a large poster by a company called Gigaclear advertising the opportunity to sign up for a village initiative to bring fibre broadband to the Pitton and Farley and Firsdown area. I must stress that I do not work for this company and there are doubtless other similar suppliers. However, a look at this particular initiative's website shows what can be done when a community pulls together.

It is clearly important to assess demand and special local needs. For instance, the Odstock and Nunton area includes a significant agricultural and farming community alongside thriving small businesses, holiday homes and tradespeople. A formal survey would need to capture all this. As a first step, however, I am prepared to act as a "post box" for your views, ideas and thoughts. If you feel strongly enough about this (even if you want nothing to do with computers!) do please get in touch. I look forward to hearing your views. If the response is positive I will investigate producing a more detailed survey. In any case, I will keep News and Notes updated in due course.
