Richard Morgan 1940 - 2021

Richard Morgan, who died on 26 May, had, with his wife Margaret, lived in Bodenham since he retired as Warden (headmaster) of Radley College in 2000. As many will know, he had been ill for some time, bearing it with typical fortitude.

Richard was born in Weston-super-Mare but his childhood home was in South Wales where his father was a County Court Judge. He was proud of his Welsh ancestry and a keen supporter of his nation's teams, especially rugby. Educated at Sherborne and Caius College, Cambridge, he worked briefly in industry before embarking on a teaching career, starting at Radley where he taught History and English as well as becoming a much respected Social Tutor (housemaster) before being appointed Headmaster of Cheltenham in 1978. He returned to Radley as Warden in 1990.

Richard oversaw a wonderful decade at Radley; academic standards soared, the College's reputation grew and, with sport very dear to his heart (Richard himself was a fine cricketer and fives player), there was a vintage period of cricket with the First XI losing just once in a seven year stretch, the 1995 rugby XV went undefeated and the rowing VIII won the Princess Elizabeth Cup at Henley in 1998. The campus development over his time included the wonderful Queen's Court; he was very proud of being able to welcome the Queen and Prince Philip to open the new building in 1997. Another lasting legacy was the setting up of the Radley Foundation, which he helped found and served as the first Chairman. When COVID restrictions permit, a service of thanksgiving for his life will be held in Radley College Chapel.

Following his retirement Richard served as a Governor of Sherborne School and Clifton College where he was Chairman. He was also a trustee of Salisbury Museum where he was one of the driving forces behind the magnificent Constable and Turner exhibitions. He was Chair of the Prince's Trust in Wiltshire.

Richard was Trustee and then President of the South Wiltshire Mencap, where he is warmly remembered for his 'zest for life and his enthusiastic partnership with the learning disabled.' He was also a visitor at Alabaré, and a Lay Worship Leader here in the parish.

On occasions he wrote the front page of News & Notes, his wise words and unique perception on local and national topics was always greatly appreciated.

Our sympathy and prayers are with Margaret, their daughters Pippa, Victoria and Rachel, their husbands and three grandchildren.

Online social engineering is on the rise

Just don't let the hackers and scammers get to you

What is Social Engineering?

“Social engineering” applies to the intentional and manufactured manipulation of people for the purposes of committing fraud. This fraud can be purely digital, or a combination of online and offline actions taken to deceive or compromise an individual or group.

This can be done on a targeted basis or through a “spray and pray” approach. The ends vary as well, ranging from planting trojans or backdoor exploits to committing fraud or to simply stealing a password.

This form of manipulation uses tactics that have little difference from a high pressure sales scenario or aggressive marketing techniques, but in these cases are turned towards explicitly fraudulent or malicious ends.

For tips to prevent social engineering attack or in other words ‘being scammed’.

1. Never reveal passwords or pins via email or phone no matter how legitimate the request seems. Companies don't ask for these this way.
2. Call them back. If you receive a call from a company requesting sensitive information, ask for their full name and call back on the number from their website.
3. Resist the urge to click on suspicious links from anyone, even if you think you know them - always double check the website address first.
4. Think twice. If something sounds too good to be true, then it probably is. Even if it looks and sounds like it's coming from a reputable source.

Types of attack

Phishing, smishing, vishing

Scammers will reach you using emails, texts, and phone calls, for example, they might do this pretending to be your bank. If it's legitimate, a company will let you contact them using official company channels.

Capturing curiosity

Curiosity is a big part of our human nature — it's how we evolve. But it's also a weakness for scammers to exploit. Found an abandoned USB stick? Never put it into your computer, it's an easy way for hackers to break in.

Quid pro quo

Quite often, scammers will offer you something like technical assistance, access to a protected document, or a solution for a problem. They may not ask for money! Their goal is your login or bank details, which they can then use or sell.

Your Salisbury Pantry seeks volunteer drivers

An opportunity to make a difference to your local community, to work alongside the Salisbury City Council Communities Team, to build a sustainable social supermarket for the City.

Your Salisbury Pantry is a social supermarket located at 59 Catherine Street and has been operating since 20 April 2021. Organised by Salisbury City Council's Communities Team, the pantry is part of a Church Action on Poverty franchise called 'My Local Pantry'. This friendly shop is a membership scheme for residents of Salisbury City who are on benefits or low incomes and who struggle to balance the challenging demands on their household income. We currently have 150 members, a number which is increasing week on week.

A social supermarket is a place for people to shop and choose food at a low cost, made possible by stocking donated and redistributed food. We are also a community resource where people can ask for advice and be signposted to other sources of support and our aim is for Your Salisbury Pantry to be a space where members can build connections, confidence, and sense of belonging in the community.

Volunteering

This has been a community project from the outset, and we already work with many volunteers and supporting organisations. Now we need a particular type of volunteer support to help us with one of our biggest challenges - collecting all of our food donations from local supermarkets and suppliers and moving it between our storage space and shop, so that we can continue to provide this valuable service for our members. This is becoming a bigger challenge as the Communities Team start to reopen their other programmes and community centres across the city, as well as running this project.

We are looking for drivers who can see the value and need for a social supermarket and who can make short trips around the city area to help transport dried and tinned food from storage to the shop or to collect donations from our supporting supermarkets. Drivers will need access to their own vehicle and be covered by their own insurance, but will be able to claim fuel expenses for the journeys they do for us.
