The CRP is a modern, well-equipped centre devoted mainly to the care, treatment and rehabilitation of severely disabled people and the training and development of health professionals.

Located at Savar in Bangladesh, it has been growing in size and importance for the past 24 years. CRP strives to treat and rehabilitate people with all forms of paralysis to enable them to lead as full a life as possible. It caters for all ages and backgrounds. With 100 beds, operating theatres, x-ray facilities, pathology laboratory and busy outpatients clinic, it is widely recognised as a Centre of Excellence.

As a non-government organisation (NGO), CRP is independent of the Bangladesh national health programme and does not receive money from the state.

Diane Wait

The 9th February meeting got under way with a warm and friendly greeting for members and guests from Mrs Julia Joynt (President). Mrs Pat Reeves was given a warm welcome following her recent hip operation. She is making excellent progress. Miss Irene Hayes read the prayer and the lovely Spring flower arrangement for the President's table was provided by Mrs Barbara Stevens. Mrs Val Martyn was delighted to report that members had thoroughly enjoyed the play "Waters of the Moon" and was taking bookings for the forthcoming Playhouse production of "Children of a Lesser God". The Summer outings were briefly discussed and Miss Judith Johnson reported that there will be two choices this year comprising a Lunch followed by a "talk" at The Emblems and later in the Summer a trip to Uppark in West Sussex. Julia reported that the 60th Anniversary Garden Party on June 14 will be held at Nunton House and she has asked for volunteers to help with the heavy workload involved on the day. Sadly this will be the last Garden Party to be held at Nunton House so it is hoped that more people than ever will come along to enjoy this event. Mrs Jean Van Hagen (Secretary) read out the correspondence, which included a request from the Wiltshire Federation for members' favourite recipes to be included in a book they are producing. Mrs Margaret Barrow (Treasurer) read out her financial report and a stunning pink Camellia, courtesy of Miss Betty Marks, was judged to be the worthy winner of the flower of the month competition.

Following the coffee break, we were treated to a very entertaining and interesting talk by Commodore Ian Gibb on the subject of Trinity House, which was founded by Henry VIII in 1514. He wished to ensure the safety of his sailing ships which were being sunk with monotonous regularity. Elizabeth I then gave a Royal Charter to Trinity and 32 Senior Mariners were appointed to look after the waters of England and Wales to ensure the safety of shipping. The first lighthouse to be constructed was known as the Eddystone Lighthouse and was made of wood. Although it survived for about three years it was eventually blown down in a violent storm, which sadly claimed the life of the person who had constructed it. Following that event, with lessons learned, more substantial lighthouses were built and buoys were used to make navigation safer. About five years ago lighthouses became fully automated and now provide 99.98% efficiency around the coast. Trinity House also owns some Almshouses in Walmer, which at one time provided homes for sailors and their families down on their luck. With the income received from property and farmland Trinity sponsors 75 cadets a year wishing to make a career of the sea. Prince Phillip is the current Master of Trinity and Sir Ted Heath is an Elder Brother.

Commodore Gibb became an Elder Brother in 1996. Other famous names have included Sir Winston Churchill, the Duke of Wellington and Samuel Pepys. We all enjoyed the talk immensely and, following some interesting questions, Mrs Gill Dodd gave a most appreciative vote of thanks.

The next meeting is the Annual General Meeting on Monday, 8th March at 10.00am in the Radnor Hall when members will have the opportunity to vote for the new Committee for the coming year.
