Alpha Courses

These courses have been welcomed to the Salisbury Diocese by the Bishop of Salisbury. They set out clearly the main beliefs of Christianity and are "mainstream" in that they are being used widely, not only in the Church of England, but also in Free Churches and some Roman Catholic parishes. Concentrating on main "core" beliefs, their broad appeal is due both to the very interesting, thought-provoking and well illustrated material used, and the excellent quality of the presentation on tape by an Anglican clergyman who is an extremely gifted communicator.

The first "local parish" meeting of this nature was held in Charlton on Monday 1 May 1995. There was an excellent response and after 10 weekly sessions, we numbered 16 at the "ALPHA" supper party which concluded the course.

We were extremely encouraged by those who attended the Summer Group, and feel the "ALPHA" course, with its commendable material should be offered to others. Church members and non-church members are equally welcome.

Many people wonder what reasons are put forward for the truth of basic Christian claims, and these "ALPHA" sessions provide an opportunity to give the matter a fair hearing in a relaxed and congenial setting.
