





**SKITTLES EVENING:** Friday 28 June In the Radnor Arms. BBQ will be available and prizes for the highest scorer.


**JUMBLE SALE:** Wednesday 3rd July in the Radnor Hall at 7pm. All jumble will be gratefully received by Muriel Ford.
