Remembering

Revd Jenny Taylor

The Chalke Valley has completed its round of glorious Harvest Festivals, but now the mood changes. November is a month for memories, many sad, as we remember those whom we have loved but who have now died. 1st November is All Saints' Day and the 2nd is designated as All Souls' Day. On All Saints' we give thanks for all the saints, both known and unknown, and on All Souls' we remember particularly those whom we have loved but who have died. Then there is Remembrance Day on 11th November preceded by Remembrance Sunday on 9th November when we join our whole nation in remembering those who have fallen in war. This year, of course, it is a particularly poignant time as we mark the centenary of the outbreak of the First World War.

It is all too easy to dwell on the negative at this time instead of understanding that each life, whether short or long, is unique, gives of itself and leaves an impression on those of us who are left. Whenever a person is remembered that impression deepens, and that life becomes intertwined with our own. Yes, we are sad at loss and rightly so, but reflecting on words from St Paul can lift even the most sorrowful of hearts:

"For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

A team of volunteers have touched up the paint work, and the carpet will be laid later this week. We also hope to improve the lighting. 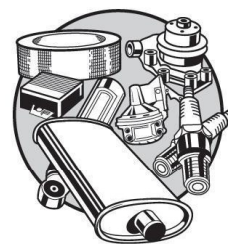

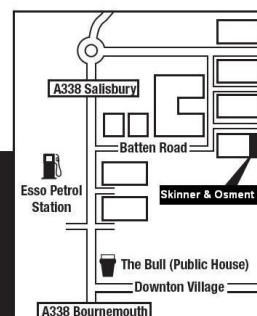
