So I give thanks to God for our community, those I might be tempted to take for granted, and especially any who are in special need at this time.

So my pin-board is not just useful – but a wonderful prompt for prayer!

## Steam-Driven Nostalgia

As one travels north up the M3 from the M27 – as one occasionally must, I suppose – you come to a place where the motorway goes over the crest of a hill and there before you, on the other side of the valley, lies the infamous Twyford Down cutting. To the left of this there is a large, squat hill with a copse on top, which looks for all the world like a turned-out Christmas pudding, only green. This is St. Catherine's Hill and is the venue of this scrap of nostalgia.

Twice a year, at the beginning of the September and the May terms, it was and still is the custom for the whole school at which I spent five happy years to walk up to the top of the hill: by whole school, I mean just that. Headmaster, teachers, boys – the lot – walked, before breakfast – to the top of St. Catherine's Hill, there to form up round the maze that is cut into the turf and to go through the ceremony of a full roll-call. As the head of the school, the senior scholar, called out the names of the boys in descending order of academic seniority, we stepped forward, raised our hat to the Headmaster, and walked across the maze and back down to the school for breakfast. Why and why there – that's another article!

First thing on a September or May morning, the weather was apt to be stunning and the panoramic view from the top of the hill was breathtaking: from Southampton way over to the left right up to the Micheldever Downs and Beacon Hill near Newbury to the right. On one of these wonderful mornings there occurred something of which the Editor unwittingly reminded me in his excellent piece including his Hornby Dublo "Mallard" locomotive.

As I stood there, quite junior, waiting for my name to be called, a train came up the valley and I could, and did, watch it progress from south of Otterbourne right up to Winchester. As if by a miracle of meteorology the air was quite still and quite cold with the result that the exhausted vapour (smoke or steam if you like) from the engine's funnel hung still in the air! The remarkable effect was to leave a suspended trail of white "smoke", gradually gathering height and breadth, all the way up the valley behind the train and it was still coming out of the funnel when the train passed me at about St. Cross and shortly after shut the regulator (the throttle!) for the slow-down approach to Winchester City station. (In those days there was still the Cheesehill station, known officially as Winchester Chesil, so the word "city" was needed.)

I very nearly missed hearing my name called but the Lord was clearly doubly on my side that morning: I had witnessed a steam-caused miracle and been spared dire retribution all in a few minutes. I have never seen anything like this steam effect since then but my love of trains has done nothing but increase over the years. I am now longing for my own lay-out, starting with either a "Lord Nelson" or a re-built Bulleid Pacific "Merchant Navy"! I fear I may long for long, if you see what I mean!

## Childcare in Wiltshire

Parents in Wiltshire are being asked to give their views on childcare services across the county.

A survey of almost 2,000 Wiltshire parents conducted earlier this year highlighted 31 percent found childcare issues had prevented them, or their partner, starting a job, keeping a job or training.

Wiltshire Council aims to address local childcare concerns in the recent draft of its Childcare Sufficiency Assessment Report. The report is out for consultation now at [www.wiltshire.gov.uk/childcare](http://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/childcare) and all comments need to be received by March 20. The final report will be published by April 1 and will show how the council is addressing the issues that have arisen in the assessment.

Wiltshire's Family Information Service (FIS) at ask holds a wealth of information about Ofsted registered childcare in Wiltshire, including day nurseries, pre schools, childminders, nanny agencies, before and after school clubs, and holiday clubs including those which are able to care for children with difficulties and disabilities. They can be contacted on 08457 585072 or at [www.askwiltshire.org](http://www.askwiltshire.org).

The charity ask supports parents and carers in Wiltshire through providing information, advice and services.

FIS can also give advice on the different types of care available, how much tax credit people might be entitled to and other types of help such as Salary Sacrifice, the pre-tax childcare vouchers arranged through employers.

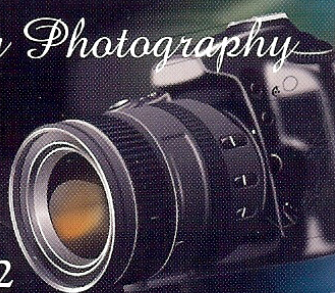
