## Christmas

Christmas is not the oldest of the Christian Festivals – certainly Easter and even Epiphany go back further. It is a gradual coming together of ancient pre-Christian mid-winter celebrations and the Christian remembering of the significance of the birth of Jesus – the mysterious “incarnation” or “God becoming a human being and sharing our lives and world”. Both are happy occasions “light out of darkness”, looking forward to a Spring-time ahead and the giving of presents has become a natural part of these festivities.

Presents are given across the Christian world – ranging from St. Nicholas’ Day (6th December) in Germany, through St. Lucia’s Day (13th December) in Scandinavia, to the Orthodox Christians of the East who have to wait until Epiphany (6th January) before they can open theirs. Christmas is a Season rather than just a brief moment; a season that centres on the idea of generosity - the generosity of God towards us and the generosity of ourselves towards each other and especially towards those in need.

There are many practical opportunities over Christmas to be generous to our neighbour – food and toys for local charities, the Christmas collections and the endless appeals for Good Causes, quite apart from the giving of presents and cards to family and friends. But it is not just financial. Christmas is also about a generosity of spirit, generosity of attitude and a generosity of time. All these are probably more important in the long run, but they seem to be in rather short supply in our society at the moment. So we are quick to criticise, to condemn, to question the motives, to look for scapegoats and to demand recompense – and these attitudes of mistrust and confrontation are beginning to eat away at our morale and the way we regard one another. Christmas challenges this meanness of spirit with its message of generosity – generosity being the nature of God and generosity being the true nature and purpose of each of us.

May you and your families all have a very Happy and Generous Christmas and every Blessing for the New Year.

In October we had a gardening Saturday with parents, staff and friends. This marks the beginning of our school's involvement in a countywide Vibrancy project, jointly organised by the Wiltshire LEA and Bath Spa University. Our school is one of only 3 other schools south of Devizes to win a place in this scheme. It will create extra opportunities for innovative curriculum developments that will enhance all the children's learning. A felt making workshop for both parents and children was held in November, this was another activity linked to the project.

The two teachers from the Gambia had a very productive fortnight with us. We held a welcome ceremony for them when they first arrived. One of the main themes we concentrated on was similarities and differences between our markets and those of the Gambia. All the children and the Gambian teachers visited Salisbury market as a prelude to designing and running our own school market.

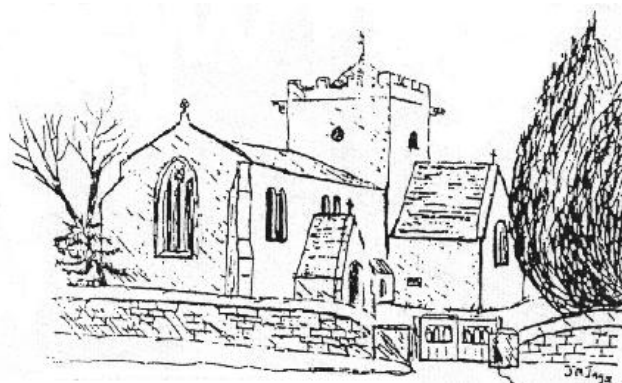
