Way back in the August issue I gave an update on the parking problems outside the hospital and hoped to have the parking restrictions in place by November/December. In spite of all the funding and other necessary paperwork being completed, the work was still not done by the end of the year. This delay has been taken to the highest authority and I now have a date of 19th & 20th January for the necessary road patching to take place, with 23rd January for the lining gang to put down the yellow lines. These dates are weather dependent and as this road is the main route to the hospital it is salted as a priority. Too much salt on the road would prevent the lines being laid.


Little Cryptic Crossword
