It's been a busy few weeks. On the fun side, Magpies (years 2 and 3) went to the New Forest Wildlife Centre (formerly known as the Butterfly Farm) as part of the Science theme of life cycles. The children loved visiting the butterfly house and seeing the unique life cycle of these beautiful creatures. They had a wonderful guide to show them the wild animals and were particularly delighted to see the elusive lynx.

The following week, Kestrels (Reception and year 1) donned wellies and old clothes to visit the Coombe Bissett Nature Reserve. The highlight of the trip was travelling in the trailer pulled by a tractor but the children also enjoyed stroking the lambs, meeting a friendly bull and some calves and seeing a dog jump out of a window. But as well as seeing domestic animals, the children were delighted to spot a sparrow hawk hovering overhead from where 'they can read a newspaper on the ground' Alex told everyone at the Friday assembly.

On a more serious note, Year 2 and Year 6 pupils worked very hard towards their SATS tests. To keep them company, all the other year groups sat their own in-school tests in early May. Destiny, who is in year 4, felt the year 6 pupils in her class deserved a treat for working so hard, so she baked them a chocolate cake at the end of test week. It looked beautiful and, I hear, tasted delicious.

Claire Brown Appeal

Claire Brown, who was born and brought up in Odstock, has been diagnosed with a spinal injury and Functional Neurological Disorder (FND) with Tremor. Claire's consultant has advised she needs more treatment but must find her own funding. She has to raise £50,000, and is about a quarter of the way there.

FND is caused by a problem with the functioning of the nervous system and is thought to derive from the brain's inability to send and receive signals properly. This then causes abnormalities between planning a movement and carrying it out. This leaves Claire unable to walk unaided, and with chronic pain and shakes throughout her body. It also affects her memory, speech and eyesight.

Carers' Week 6th-12th June

Caring is part of being human and at the heart of family life. As our population ages and people live longer, often with complex health conditions, more and more of us will find ourselves caring with 3 in 5 of us becoming carers at some point in our lives.

A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who cannot manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse.

Many people don't identify themselves as carers, they feel they are just doing what anyone else would so they don't always know what support is available to them.

Carer Support Wiltshire is a local charity supporting carers in Wiltshire. They help them to access support, services, education and training, and breaks from their caring role. As part of Carers Week (6th-12th June) they will be celebrating the contribution unpaid carers make to families and communities in Wiltshire with their Walk a Mile in My Shoes sponsored walk. Walkers are encouraged to decorate their trainers or swap shoes with a relative or friend and show their support for carers. The walk will take place at John Coles Park in Chippenham. Love and the Bard

The Farrant Singers, conducted by Andrew Mackay, are joined by actor and opera singer Simon McEnery to present 'Love and the Bard', an evening of music and readings devoted to the subject of love.

They will perform settings of texts from the Old Testament's 'Song of Songs' by composers as diverse as Palestrina, Guerrero and Victoria (contemporaries of William Shakespeare) and Francis Grier who is still writing today. Grier's *'Dilectus Meus Mihi'* is beautifully crafted with a mystical feel, and of special significance is 'The Voice of my Beloved' which was written for the conductor's wedding twenty five years ago.

Woven through the programme are love poems and readings by Christopher Marlowe, Robert Herrick and John Donne, again all contemporaries of Shakespeare, read by Simon. Madrigals and English part songs from 16th century composers such as John Wilbye and John Ward as well as works by Charles Villiers Stanford and Edward Elgar feature in the second half, this time interspersed with the writings of Shakespeare on the theme of love.

The concert takes place at All Saints' Church, Broad Chalke on Saturday 25th June at 7.30pm.






