I am so lucky to live in a wonderful, loving community. Two and a half years ago, I had a routine blood test because I had a nasty habit of bruising. The results were completely unexpected, especially as I had just returned from a wonderful holiday and felt great. After further tests, I was diagnosed with a very rare leukaemia, which usually effects old men!

I was given sixteen months to live, unless they could do a bone marrow transplant, but there was so little research. The prospects weren't good!

Luckily, we live near to Southampton where Dr Richardson was conducting a trial to cure acute and myeloid leukaemia. She agreed to put me into the trial. I needed to find a compatible donor. My siblings were thought to be my best chance. We rejoiced when we found my elder brother was compatible. After further tests and a week before I was supposed to start my treatment, Dr Richardson decided she wanted to find a more compatible donor. This is where Anthony Nolan came in. They found a completely compatible donor; a 32 year old from USA.

On 30th December 2012, I was admitted into an isolation cell for seven long weeks of very intensive treatment. It was awful but I felt cocooned in a parcel of love and prayer. Eighteen months later, I am back from the dead and so very grateful.

I decided to run a car boot sale to raise funds for Anthony Nolan. I had never run one before. Well I did it, with help of a marvellous team and support from the Church. We had 115 sellers, lots of buyers, and twice as many homemade cakes and savouries than usual, which all went. We raised £1,300, for which I am so grateful. So is the Anthony Nolan Trust. Enormous thanks to all those who helped.

I must say that prayer helped me a great deal during the whole process of diagnosis and treatment, especially during those fretful hours in the middle of the night. Prayer helped me through the Car Boot Sale too!




