## The Offa's Dyke Path

I've just returned from a splendid couple of weeks walking the Offa's Dyke Path, a National Trail which runs about 180 miles between Chepstow on the coast of South Wales to Prestatyn on the North coast. I walked with three old school friends; old friends in both senses, in that we have known each other a long time, and have all been OAPs for at least a year! That's our excuse for only averaging around thirteen miles a day, but it's worth mentioning that much of it was quite hilly, and we did have to stop for refreshments once in a while. I must say it's a puzzle as to why, after all that exercise, I weigh a little more than I did when I set off.

There's been some speculation recently as to whether it was Offa who oversaw the building of the Dyke, or perhaps a predecessor, and about precisely what its purpose was. It didn't matter much to my friends and me, as we were just grateful to have it as the basis for a wonderful walk with many lovely views, quite a few of them of the 360<sup>o</sup> variety. Having said that, it was always fun to identify those many stretches of the Path which precisely follow the course of the Dyke, or when you could see it across a field or running down the side of a hill.

If any readers are interested in finding out more about the Offa's Dyke Path, I'd be happy to help, and would promise not to inflict on them the 500 photographs I took along the way!

While walking, I did from time to time reflect on the fact that, while the countryside around our villages is not necessarily as spectacular as some that I saw, it is truly beautiful, and we are very lucky to live among it. I am looking forward to getting my boots on again to walk in this neck of the woods.

## Faster Broadband

The provision of faster Broadband is gradually being rolled out in the News and Notes villages. I'm told by Alan Pollard, who has kindly investigated for us, that it is already available in Bodenham and Nunton, and will very soon be in Odstock too. Availability in Britford is predicted for the summer.

The comment received re Charlton All Saints is "We are still working on the infrastructure that feeds this community. Unfortunately we have come across some issues with blockages in the ducting. I don't as yet have an update on when this will be ready for service."

As and when the faster Fibre service is available in your village, you will need to contact your ISP (internet service provider) either through their website or by 'phone to sign up for it, if they can supply it. This won't necessarily involve an increase in cost, although of course experience may differ between the various providers. It's possible, too, that some providers will not have access to the new service, in which case a move to another ISP will be necessary to enjoy the faster speeds.

## The Radnor Hall, Bodenham

### Chairman's report on 2013/2014 – Harry Joynt

Hall activities continued to expand with hire income increasing by over a quarter, of which some 10% will have been due to an increase in hiring rates, these having been held unchanged for the previous three and a half years. There was a slight reduction in income from parties and receptions but increases in all other user categories. The condition and appearance of the Hall and the range of facilities continue to draw favourable comment.

Our fund raising programme was maintained with successful car boot sales and the start of table top sales. The Hall was packed as usual for the November pantomime. Additions and improvements included new lights in the main hall, a keypad locking system at the main entrance door for better access control, and the purchase of larger lightweight folding tables for use at table top sales and at the Fete tea tent.

Towards the end of the period the caretakers, Jenny and Steve Compton, gave notice and moved to Salisbury. They had served us well over their five years with us, finishing with a much greater activity level in the Hall compared to when they started. We were sorry to see them go and wish them well. We believe we have found very suitable replacements in Anna and Christopher Wilson who know the area and who will be taking up residence in the Hall cottage in early summer after substantial refurbishment works there have been completed by the Longford Estate. They are most welcome.

Our thanks are due to all volunteers who help in various ways at fund raising events, and to all committee members, particularly the Treasurer and the member responsible for property maintenance and improvements. We very much appreciate the continuing support of the Parish Council through its regular contribution towards meeting our rental costs, and of the ONB Fête Committee for their grants towards hall improvements. We continue to be extremely grateful to the Longford Estate for their generosity over many years in providing the community with such an attractive and well maintained village hall building at a very modest rent.

The outlook for the coming year is encouraging, with two new groups hiring the Hall on a regular basis and with plans to provide more user facilities. Our overall financial objective remains unchanged, namely to maintain a level of funds available so as to cover at least one year's operating turnover. The financial surplus made last year, together with fund raising and prospective grants, should enable us to acquire a high speed commercial dishwasher for the kitchen and a Public Address and Induction Loop System for the main hall. We also aim to install new ceiling insulation in the main hall in order to provide more efficient heating at less cost.

In early 2011, the Hall qualified at Level 2 under "Hallmark", a nationally recognised quality standards scheme for village halls. Renewed accreditation is mandatory after three years. We are confident that we have maintained or even improved our standards and intend shortly to re-apply.




