For all the Saints

A question I have been asked a couple of times recently is why churches are dedicated to particular saints. The honest truth is that I don't know... the origins of the practice probably lie in the building of churches on the sites of the martyrdom of inspirational saints, but nowadays that only accounts for relatively small proportion of churches in the world, even fewer in Britain, and none at all in the Chalke Valley Benefice! Still, I thought it might be interesting to think about who the saints are to whom the various churches covered by the "News and Notes" area are.

Odstock's church is dedicated to St Mary, one of the most popular dedications for churches. Mary, of course was the mother of Jesus. Her role in the Bible is limited... Luke's Gospel gives us some stories about her in relation to the conception, birth and early life of Jesus... so to a lesser extent does Matthew's, though it focusses more on Joseph. John's Gospel has her present at the miracle of Cana and at the foot of the cross. Other gospel accounts tell of her anxiety at Jesus' ministry and attempts to dissuade him! The early church built considerably on these scraps of information and developed complex theories about her role in redemption, which protestants have refuted but which were certainly very strong in the belief and spirituality of the middle ages, when Odstock and so many other churches were dedicated to St Mary. *(continued on page 2)*

For all the Saints (continued from page 1)

Britford's church is dedicated to St Peter and Nunton's to St Andrew, a happy (but probably coincidental) coupling, as the two were brothers. Peter is regarded as the leader of the disciples, authorised by Jesus who gave him his name. "Peter" is an English version of "Petros" meaning "Stone" ... Jesus said that he would be the foundation stone of the church. His original name was "Simon". Sometimes the bible calls him "Cephas", another Greek word for "stone". He let Jesus down by disowning him when he was arrested, but was reaffirmed by Jesus after his resurrection. He was key in preaching to others at the feast of Pentecost, bringing many to faith, and came to realise also that the message of the Gospel was not only for Jews, but for people of all races. There is a strong tradition that he put this into practice, preaching the Gospel in Rome, where he was put to death.

But none of this could have happened if he had not first been brought to faith by Andrew, his brother and business partner (they were both fishermen). John the Baptist told Andrew that he believed Jesus to be God's chosen one, and Andrew in turn invited Peter to come and see Jesus. For this reason, he is sometimes called the first missionary, for it is the work of a missionary to invite others to meet Jesus. Legend has it that Andrew died as a martyr in Greece, refusing to be crucified in the same way as Jesus, and so being nailed to a diagonal cross. Thus Scotland, which has St Andrew as its patron saint, has a diagonal cross in its flag. St Andrew is believed to have converted the Scythians (a people who lived around the Black Sea) to Christianity, and there is an ancient legend that the Picts were descended from the Scythians, hence the dedication of Scotland to St Andrew.

The last of our quartet of churches is All Saint's Charlton. The dedication "All Saints" might perhaps more fully be rendered "All Saints except the ones who have their own special days" ... in other words, the vast crowd of those whom history has forgotten, but who nevertheless made their contribution to the life and mission of the church throughout history. We remember them, of course, on November 1st. It is a reminder that in the Bible, the only usage of the word "Saints" (Greek: "Hagioi") is not to refer to a special elite, but to all who follow Jesus. It is a reminder that all Christians are "saints". Great heroes and heroines such as Mary, Peter and Andrew may have made major contributions to the spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, but we are all called to play our own part.




