In May, I had the real pleasure of walking the Coast to Coast path from St Bees Head in Cumbria to Robin Hood's Bay in North Yorkshire.

Had our path taken us through the villages covered by News and Notes, their charm and the surrounding countryside would have measured up very well with, and added variety to, the rest of the walk. Not only that, but they would have been full of friends too, as we discovered at our Jubilee parties, and will discover again at our Fêtes and Barbeques. Aren't we lucky!






