Y Wurry?

I was born and brought up in Reigate, Surrey. A short distance from our house, which was simply number 7, was one called "Y Wurry". This ranks pretty high in my list of memorable house names, at the top of which list is a rather run-down basement apartment my father once told me he had seen in a London suburb. It was called "Wuthering Depths"!

I didn't know the people who lived in "Y Wurry", so have no real idea of why they chose the name. They may have been those rare sort of people who pass through life without a care in the world and wanted to broadcast the fact. If so, they were in stark contrast to the folk who lived in another house I've heard about called "Wit's End"!

Like those at their wit's end, I suspect most of us worry from time to time. It seems a fairly natural thing to do. We worry about things like international conflicts, the state of the world economy and city riots. We probably worry even more about friends and family and our own circumstances.

There's an advertisement on page 5 seeking volunteers to work at the Citizen's Advice Bureau, a splendid organisation designed to help those who have worries of various kinds. We, too, can help those around us when we see that they are worried about things. Sometimes just a listening ear can be a great comfort and, at other times, more practical help is very welcome.

My observation is that we are all very lucky to live in an area where people tend to look out for each other and like to be asked for help.

As far as our own worries are concerned, as well as accepting help from those around us, perhaps we should try, as far as possible, to "consider the lilies of the field"!*

Stars Appeal Fun Run

Entries are now open for the seventh annual Tidworth 10k & 3k Fun Run. The increasingly popular event which is in aid of the Salisbury District Hospital Stars Appeal and organised with the assistance of 1st Mechanised Brigade Headquarters and Signal Squadron (215) will take place at Tidworth House on Sunday 6th November. Over 1,000 people took part last year.

Runners can choose between a 3k and 10k route which both start and finish at Tidworth House. The 10k goes through the army camp before heading off on to Salisbury Plain. The runs have become a key part of the Stars Appeal's annual fundraising. 




