Paradoxes and wrong associations... Holy Week unwrapped

I once shocked a congregation in a sermon by throwing a wine bottle across church – the gasp was audible as arms reached out to catch it before it crashed to the stone floor. Then of course, they quickly realised that it was a plastic bottle – a perfect replica of a fine Bordeaux claret nonetheless! Things have strong associations. So the sound of a piano accordion, a navy beret, and string of garlic immediately evokes France (or a wine-bottle!). When it comes to thinking about royalty, and we shall be doing a lot of this in 2012, there are likewise strong associations; see a gold carriage or historic crown, or hear the National Anthem and we immediately think of the Queen and the Royal Family. Other words also come to mind; majesty, pomp, ceremony. Our celebrations later this year will pay tribute to a remarkable reign of a Queen who has given herself to our country and Commonwealth.

Which brings me back to why I threw that bottle. What springs to mind when we think of Jesus as King? Where are the associations of kingship and majesty? And here we meet the great paradox. This King is very different from any usual royal expectations. Jesus came as Lord – but knelt like a slave to wash the dirty feet of his disciples. For a crown, Jesus would wear a crown of sharp thorns. For a royal robe, mocking soldiers would drape a red cloth around him and spit at him. And his coronation and moment of greatest triumph would be a cruel and humiliating crucifixion on a hill outside Jerusalem. Could this really be God's anointed King and promised Saviour? Yes. Here was - and is - God's answer to all our needs. A crucified God who saves us from our sins. And a risen Lord who takes away our fear of death. New life and hope are ours. Yes, Easter is why I am a Christian!






