Just thinking aloud.....

Even though my student days are long past, I still associate June with exams. Stuck inside revising, while outside the sun would invariably shine and temperatures soar. Cramming my brain with French quotes, or dates from history, or mathematical proofs... Science was never my strong subject but of course, in my day, it was never taught in a very exciting way! Nowadays I love documentaries exploring the natural world, or how the human body works, or the amazing complexities of the universe.

People often think that science has dispensed with the need for religion, or somehow conflicts with faith. I have friends who are both brilliant research scientists and committed Christians. They are humble enough to know that Mankind is not the centre of the universe, and wise enough to make good links between their studies and their spiritual life. They have both a heart to praise God for what they discover and admire, with the humility to recognise human failings and a forgiving God. Meanwhile, some popular atheists who currently enjoy a lot of publicity seem (to me at least!) extremely arrogant and certain of things.

Children are naturally inquisitive and ask questions about the world and God in almost the same breath. What makes a computer work? When did God make the world? How does the pip get into an apple? What does God eat for breakfast? I don't have all the answers – I wish I did! Exploring our world, making sense of things, asking questions is how we express our humanity. So maybe we need to keep a child-like, open-minded curiosity about life and the BIG questions. We might be surprised who we discover.....

At the meeting on 9th May, the President thanked Sandra Moody for her vibrant flowers on the President's table and opened the Resolution Meeting. This meeting is an annual occurrence when members debate two resolutions. A full house of participants had arrived for the occasion.

The results of our voting are taken by a local delegate to the National WI Federation conference in Liverpool this year. Two members presented the arguments for each topic: the first by Louise Jeffreys that "This meeting urges HM Government to maintain support for local libraries as an essential educational resource for the community". This was discussed from a local view-point and the vote FOR the motion was carried unanimously.

The second by Liz Hardman was that "This meeting appals the practice of factory farming, large animals in particular, and urges HM Government to ensure planning permission is not granted for such projects". Discussion was more emotive; many felt they did know enough about "mega" farms. Many were concerned about the impact on the environment. Most members were FOR the motion, some AGAINST and a few were undecided. The motion was carried nevertheless.

The diaries for the next few months about County and local events had been compiled by Wendy Duke and were distributed. All the groups (Theatre, Book Club, Walking, Scrabble and Skittles) are very well supported. We had a Bring-a-book, buy-a-book stall to raise funds.

The Flower of the Month was won by Ann Waite with a beautiful Alstroemeira. Finally, Hatty Hillier, who had won the bursary for Denman College last year, spoke about her first visit and course on Abstract Art. She said the college, people and course were a wonderful experience. Debbie Underhill gave the vote of thanks for the meeting.

The next meeting is the Garden Party to be held at Melstock, Nunton (weather permitting) when there will be a plant stall, bring and buy, nearly new clothes, entertainment and a wonderful tea supplied by all the members.

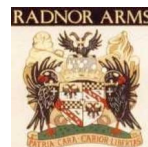

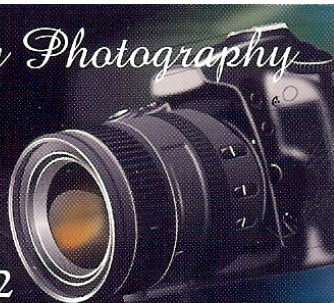
