Salisbury Cathedral is delighted to welcome the celebrated author, broadcaster, journalist and campaigner Kate Adie.

Greetings from the Southern Ocean

Sherwood & Stephanie Elcock from Nunton and Barbara Box from Charlton are currently sailing on the STS Lord Nelson from Auckland, New Zealand to Ushuaia, Argentina.

Here is an account of a typical day on board

Date: 17th January 2014, Day 34 of the voyage

Position: 45° S 115° W

06:45 I'm woken by a member of the duty watch and my watch starts at 8.00am. Steph and I share a small cabin with standing room for one. I climb down from the top bunk taking care not to wake Steph, who is in a different watch and was on the 8 till midnight watch last night.

07:20 Breakfast in the upper mess with my watch. Barbara is a member of my watch but she is on mess duty today and has been up for a while helping to lay out breakfast for the rest of the crew. Everyday, one member of each of the 4 watches serves in the galley preparing and serving food under the direction of the ship's cook, Dave, and his assistants.

08:00 My watch arrives on the bridge to take over the watch. This involves helming the ship, maintaining a lookout, making minor sail adjustments as necessary, and keeping a log of our progress.

08.45 The morning meeting is attended by the 4 watch leaders and the permanent crew. It is the Captain's briefing for the day. Information on the day's events, weather forecast and a progress report are given. The watch leaders then disseminate the information to their watches. Today we have less than 2000 nautical miles to go to Cape Horn and this evening there will be a quiz in the bar. We are now as far from land as it is possible to be anywhere on the earth's surface.

09:00 "Happy Hour". Everyone on board not required for essential tasks takes a hand in cleaning the ship. Today I'm scrubbing the deck, Barbara is helping clean the galley and Steph's watch is below deck cleaning the accommodation area. Steph is sailing as the ship's doctor but fortunately, apart from a few colds, everyone is keeping fit and there have been no injuries, although a couple of crew members have fallen heavily in the rough conditions a few days ago. So with no medical work to do Steph is on heads (toilets) cleaning duty today.

10:00 Morning Smoko, the traditional nautical name for a tea of coffee break, and once again cookie Dave has produced a wonderful chocolate cake.

11:00 Gary is sharing his knowledge of astronavigation, teaching the rest of the watch how to use a sextant and then perform the complex calculations to find our position. The ship is of course equipped with all the latest in modern technology and our position is known with a high degree of accuracy, but it is very rewarding to learn the traditional skills and find that we can determine our position to within a few miles of the GPS reading.

12:30 Steph's watch have had an early lunch and come to the bridge to relieve us. They have seen the thickening cloud and arrive well wrapped in oilskins prepared for the foul weather which may well arrive before the end of their 4 hour watch duty. It may be

mid-summer here but the mercury does not reach the mid teens even on a good day, and the wind chill makes it feel a good bit colder.

They will keep a constant lookout, although we have seen no other ships for the past 3 weeks. We have been rather disappointed to have only had a brief glimpse of a whale on this voyage but there are plenty of sea birds, and we nearly always have an albatross gliding low over the wave crests behind us.

13:00 "Quiet time" and a chance for those who were on watch overnight to catch up on sleep.

16:00 Marcin, our Polish 2nd Officer and navigator, is giving a talk on Southern Ocean Weather patterns. At present we are riding the "Roaring Forties" with strong winds and a rough sea, but soon we must head south to round the Horn and face the storms and mountainous seas for which this cape is notorious.

18:00 Dinner time – fish pie and syrup sponge. We are starting to get low on fresh fruit and vegetables as it is more than 4 weeks since we were able to take on stores, but Dave still manages to produce tasty meals.

19:00 Time for a drink at the bar to get in the mood for the evening Quiz. Barbara has finished her mess duty and has a night off watch as her reward. My watch is due back on at 20:00 but have been excused for the duration of the quiz. After that we will be donning foul weather gear and be back on the bridge until midnight as the approaching weather system overtakes us, bringing gale force winds and driving rain.

24:00 After a couple of hours sleep following the quiz, Steph and her watch are back on duty until dawn at 04:00.

We are enjoying the voyage and look forward to returning home safely next month

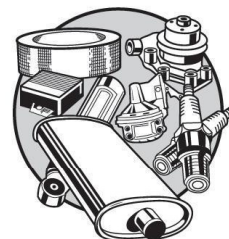

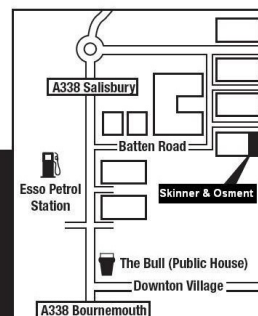
