## From our new Team Vicar, Revd Alison Williams

Thank you all so much for your extremely warm welcome into the valley. I am really looking forward to getting to know you all and becoming part of your community. Obviously everything still feels very new, so that will take some time! I keep pinching myself to check that it is not a dream that I have moved to such a very beautiful area! The vicarage is really lovely too – I feel thoroughly spoilt. Thank you.

I am a country girl at heart so wanted to be in an area where I could get to know people and build strong relationships. I believe that *relationships* are at the heart of the Christian Faith: the gospel is all about God's love for us and our response shown in the way we reflect that love and forgiveness in our human relationships.

In my farewell service in my last parish, I preached on my two loves in ministry – *building community* and *building faith*, based on a passage from Paul's letter to the Colossians (chapter 2 verses 6-7). Paul loves mixing his metaphors so urges his readers to strengthen their foundations as they build faith, and also to be strongly rooted in Christ. I don't know much about brick-laying and building, but I am a keen gardener and know that for roots to grow well they need space to stretch out in, and the right food and conditions for growth. It is my role as a pastor-teacher to encourage the space and conditions for Christian growth and ministry for the whole people of God; to help build community; and to help others find the healing love of God. Please pray for me as I begin my work with you here.

I have always loved entertaining too and look forward to using my home to get to know people. With the long summer evenings and summer holidays ahead, it is a wonderful time to move. So if I haven't met you already, please introduce yourself to me when you see me around!

At this time of year we find an increase in reported crime to garden sheds; the targets are normally petrol driven garden machinery.

You may be thinking of trading in the old mower for a new one or buying a new piece of equipment for the garden. Chances are these items will be kept in a shed or garage. Please take a moment to review your security, could it be made any better? You don't need to go to great expense to make your property secure, make sure your locks are working correctly and they are securely fitted. If you don't already have a lock, then get one. Consider investing in a small shed alarm; these are inexpensive and are very effective. We have a stock of them at the police station; if you would like one please contact me and I would be happy to deliver one and advise on installation. At a cost of just £5 it's a small price to pay.

Finally if you do purchase any new equipment please make a note of the model and serial number; without this it makes it almost impossible to identify should it be stolen and recovered.
