Odstock, Nunton and Bodenham WI

The July meeting was unusual in that it was combined with an outing to Bowood House, so business was kept to a minimum.

Members were reminded that our Autumn Lunch, £6, was on 14th September this year in order to celebrate the week that WI started 100 years ago in Anglesey. The three WI stalls at the recent Nunton Fête had been very well supported, raising over £550, and the Fête Committee had sent us their thanks and congratulations. Our thanks go to all the members who worked so tirelessly to make this event a success and contribute to our Denman Bursary fund.

Our visit to Bowood House, the property of the Lansdowne family since 1754, was a delight. Sue Amey had organised the exclusive garden tour of the private walled gardens and pleasure grounds for us. We were split into two groups of twenty and guided by Jane Milligan and Mandy Dobson. The borders on the terrace were planted with a repeat pattern of flowers and were full of colour and texture. It felt very special to have the gate to the walled gardens unlocked exclusively for us to enter. Today only four gardeners manage all the gardens and we were entranced by the variety of styles. Such a contrast between the informality of the wildflower garden inspired by the 2012 Olympics and the formality of the cutting garden which provided flowers for the house and hotel. The kitchen garden was a delightful scented mixture of small beds filled with a variety of fruit, flowers, herbs, and vegetables, and anything but boring! The chickens had their own enclosure surrounded by large herbaceous borders – my favourite being the 'hot' border zinging with vibrant sizzling colour. The walled spaces created different micro climates and sometimes we came face to face with unexpected tropical plants. Even the swimming pool was surrounded by beautiful borders.

Once outside the walled areas we were taken through the arboretum of over 700 trees, including a rare Wollomi pine brought over from Australia, and we could appreciate the landscape designed by 'Capability' Brown. Apparently Mr Brown earned his nickname from his frequent phrase of 'This has great capabilities'! The lake ended in a cascade into a deep valley where some of us experienced the doubtful enjoyment of stumbling through a pitch black tunnel! Children would love it.

The guided tour was followed by a two course lunch in the Refectory. The afternoon was the chance to explore parts of the Georgian house including the orangery, library, chapel and laboratory where Dr Joseph Priestley discovered oxygen gas. Amongst many unique items in the house were Queen Victoria's wedding chair, Napoleon's death mask and the wonderful 'Keith' Jewellery collection. What an interesting day.

Our next meeting is on 14th September at the Radnor Hall.

The sun shone down on the Longford Summer Fair on 4th July 2015 as lots of families shopped at the stalls, played on the inflatable assault course, bought raffle tickets, had a go or two on the tombola and lucky dip, tried to guess the number of sweets in the jar, looked over the visiting Fire Engine. Burgers and cream teas were washed down with beer, squash or tea. Lots of fun was had by all and the event raised an impressive total of £686.85. Huge thanks to the members of FOLS who worked so hard to organise the event.

As if that wasn't enough, a few stalwarts then turned out to run the Longford School stall at the Odstock, Nunton & Bodenham Fête the following weekend. It was lovely to see a significant number of the children and their families attending this event as well.

Year 5 attended a taster session at Trafalgar School this month and the staff were so impressed with their behaviour that they emailed the Head teacher to let her know!

Earlier this month, Kingfisher Class (years 3 – 6) visited the Salisbury Museum. Again, the staff were so impressed with their behaviour and attentiveness that they took the time to email the Head teacher to say '*Exploring the gallery the children remembered the rule about not resting clipboards on the cases, and my usual request of 'please don't run' to over enthusiastic children was not used at all! We were asked many interesting questions and the children's records of pottery in the gallery reflected their comprehension of the sketching techniques exercises carried out before visiting the gallery. They then listened well to the description of how to make a coil pot, and everyone had a really good go at making their own, requesting help when needed instead of giving up.*'

Congratulations to Kingfishers who have become amazing ambassadors for the School.

Kestrels Class (Reception) entertained their parents at an Assembly where they performed their favourite fairy tales and stories. They read and acted well and the singing wasn't bad either! We were all super proud of them.

Magpies Class (years 1-2) have been learning about communication and embarked on a tour of the village to look for different signs. They found signs that gave them information as well as warnings. They used their tour to create a large whole class replica on the classroom floor!

The results came through for the SATs tests and all our year 6 met or bettered the national standard in every single subject. Whilst they are not the 'be all and end all' of life, they do help get children ready for secondary school, and the children worked really hard and we are very proud of them. Well done year 6!

More importantly, the end of year school reports went home last week for all the children. Enlivened by colour photos, the newly formatted reports gave detailed comments about what the children have been doing throughout the year: celebrating their achievements, focussing on their strengths and offering suggestions about how to improve next year.

What are we all about?

The project gives local communities the opportunity to have a key role in the improvement of their local Public Footpaths, developing community resilience and opportunities for everyone to get involved. So far we have installed over 60 kissing gates, resurfaced a substantial amount of paths, had several vegetation clearance parties and made improvements to the waymarking across the area. We are currently working on several circular walks across the area, including Alderbury, Pitton and Downton. From these circular walks, several active parish footpath groups have been created. We plan to continue increasing access to local footpaths with the help of volunteers from local communities. Within this we will set up circular walks within Parishes to get each community involved, providing them with tools and the knowhow. This will improve access along key trails from which organised walks can be set up to increase community activity and to build connections with groups such as schools. By the end of the project the communities will be fully equipped to be able to keep their local paths in great shape.

How can you help?

Anyone can help us by becoming a volunteering whether you've got practical skills, office skills or just have a lot of local knowledge. We need people for a wide range of tasks, like installing kissing gates, putting up waymarking, vegetation clearance, attending events and editing our website.
