Calling All StoryTellers / Readers

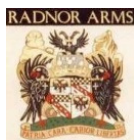
As many of you will know, there has been a Storytime

are in need of some new story tellers/readers.

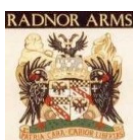
Currently we are looking at a Monday, Wednesday or

With the end of the school year fast approaching and exams completed, plans are afoot to celebrate in style.

You are all invited to the Longford School Summer Fair, taking place on Saturday 4th July from 2 – 4pm at the School (parking available at the Park & Ride). In addition to the Summer Fair, the School will also hold a stall at the Odstock, Nunton and Bodenham Fête on 11th July.

Finally, there is a Leavers' Party and Disco for Year 6 on 17th July. Being such a small school where the children all know each other well, all the children and their families are invited to celebrate the end of 7 years at primary school with the Year 6 children, before they leave to embark on the big adventure of secondary school.

While we will be sorry to see them leave, we will have the joy of new faces starting Reception in September. The School held a Welcome evening for Parents of the new Reception children earlier this month and the children will also be visiting the school during July to familiarise themselves with staff and children and their new environment.

We do have vacancies in Reception for September 2015 so please call Mrs Dee Follett in the School Office (01722 327292) if you would like more information or to arrange a visit to our lovely school.

But despite the social whirl, learning is still a priority. During this term, Kingfisher Class (years 3 – 6) will be visiting the Salisbury Museum to investigate how art has been an important part of human civilisation and how the work of various artists can give us an insight into the past. They will be making some replica posts based the examples displayed at the museum.

Kestrels Class (Reception) is holding an Assembly for Parents where they will be performing fairy tales and stories as part of their term topic of 'Let's Pretend'.

Earlier this month, Archdeacon Alan Jeans visited the school to present a beautiful wooden cross to commemorate the opening and blessing of our new hall and extension.

Finally, Sports Day will be happening in the last week of school. There will be whole school teams, games and athletics in the morning ahead of a picnic lunch with families.

On a more serious note, some of you may have heard the school mentioned on Spire fm in early June during a discussion about schools becoming Academies, when it was stated that Longford would be converting to an Academy. It is true that the Department for Education (DfE) wrote to the Chair of Governors,

appointing an Academy Broker to take forward a sponsored academy solution for the school. However, to date, the DfE have been unable to secure an academy sponsor for the school so although there is an expectation that the school will convert at some point at the future, the School is continuing to work with the strong support and funding of the Local Authority. Together we have made great strides in improving the school and Ofsted HMI Inspectors agree we are on the right track.

This is backed by the support of the children who, in a recent survey of Pupil Learning Behaviours, confirmed that they felt the school was moving in a positive direction, and there were big differences in behaviour and in the richness of the curriculum over this year.

Parents were also asked about their opinions and we are delighted with the results of this questionnaire, noting, in particular, that 'children are happy and feel safe at school' and that parents are beginning to feel 'more informed about their child's progress at school'. But, as always, when these surveys are undertaken, areas for improvement are identified and the Headteacher, Mrs Shrimpton, and the Governors will be making these a priority in the next few weeks. Copies of these surveys and the results are available via the School website www.longford.wilts.sch.uk.

Among some of the positive comments, 'lovely small friendly school', 'important that my child was not just another number in the class' and 'I appreciate the standards of education practised and the team is great'.

Staff News

After a period of ill health, Mrs Jo Smith has decided to resign her teaching post. She has been a dedicated member of staff, working hard at Longford Primary School and its predecessor school for almost 17 years. We wish her well for the future.

However, we are pleased to announce some new appointments and welcome Mr Grant, Ms Lightbourn and Mrs Mason to our team. The staffing and class arrangements for next year have been agreed:

Miss Tomlinson has been confirmed as the teacher for Kestrels Class (Reception and Year 1).

Mrs Jenny Mason, who has been teaching part-time at the school since April, will be teaching Magpies (Years 2 and 3) on Mondays – Wednesdays with Ms Lightbourn taking over on Thursdays and Fridays.

Mr Grant and Ms Lightbourn will continue to share the role of class teacher for Kingfishers (Year 4, 5 and 6).

All our teaching assistants will also be continuing with us.

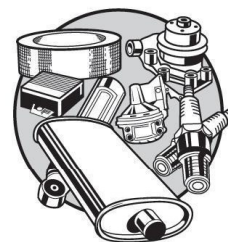

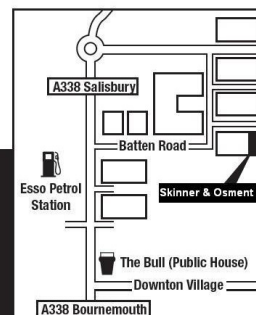

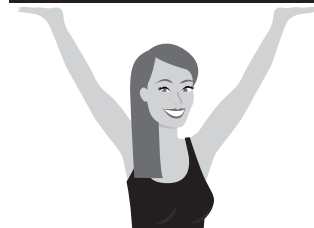
